






#### How to spot scarlet fever



If you haven't heard of us or you don't know what we do read on:

edt

If you live in the local <u>community EDT</u> offers FREE services that can be accessed by registering with EDT, for example: you can use our <u>centre</u> for internet access and printing, you can get help and support with online registration for benefits, for filling in job applications. You can do formal qualifications in English, Maths and IT, if you are interested in starting your own business you can get help and support to create your business plan.

As an incentive to get people to register with us to receive further information we will give eligible\* individuals a £20 Sainsbury's voucher, pretty useful with Christmas coming.

\* Eligibility is based on whether or not the individual can have funded access to the services we offer, EDT receives funding for <u>proving</u> these services from Liverpool Adult Learning Service (part of Liverpool City Council). Only individuals who have the right to work in the UK and live within the Liverpool council wards listed below qualify. We will check the individual's NI number and postcode to establish eligibility. This offer is for new registrations only, if you are already registered to use our services you will not qualify for a voucher.
