Therefore on Friday 29th September, staff will be reading books with a Maths link. Pupils will then create their own class versions to share with younger year groups through Reading Assemblies.


You could share your love of Reading and Maths at home by reading some of the books or playing some of the games with a Maths focus that was sent out through Parent App

SCHOOL UNIFORM



Full school uniform must be worn every day.

Please make sure it has your CHILD'S NAME in.

Nursery (F1)

pupil's uniform will be:

- Royal blue jogging suit consisting of round neck jumper . and royal blue jogging bottoms.
- White polo shirt.
- Velcro black shoes with black soles.







Reception (F2)

pupil's uniform will be:

- Royal blue jogging suit consisting of round neck jumper and royal blue jogging bottoms.
- White polo shirt.
- Velcro black shoes with black soles.
- Grey socks or tights.







Year 1 and Year 2

pupil's uniform will be:

- Royal blue round neck jumper or cardigan.
- Grey skirt/pinafore or trousers.
- White polo shirt.
- Grey socks or tights.









Years 3/4/5/6

pupil's uniform will be:

- Royal blue V neck jumper or cardigan.
- Grey skirt/pinafore or trousers.
- White shirt.
- School tie.
- Grey socks or tights.







All children from Reception through to year 6 also require a PE kit.

This consists of:

A white round neck t-shirt.

Royal blue shorts.

Royal blue jogging bottoms and Sweatshirt can also be worn.

Black pumps or black trainers only.





Exceptions can only be made if you have contacted school in advance.
