MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD TEACHER

Dear parents/carers,

We have reached the end of a very long half term. Our Y5 children returned from a lovely three day residential visit to Barnstondale. They participated in activities such as archery, rock climbing, den building and nightline. A big thank you to Miss Hogg, Mrs Townley-Jones. Mr Price and Miss Heath for accompanying the children on the visit.

Look out for information regarding our 'Superhero Day' which is due to take place on the 10th November 2023 where we will be celebrating the birthday of our wonderful pupil Dastan who we sadly lost a couple of years ago. Dastan would have been 13 on 11th November 2023. A big thank you to our parents/carers who attended our first parent forum meeting held a couple of weeks ago. For those of you who were unable to attend, I have provided a summary of some of the things we discussed.

Firstly, I explained that the Senior Leaders have collated a calendar of key events for the year which you should receive with today's newsletter. This will hopefully enable you to attend as many events as possible. We also discussed communication and the importance of school using a digital platform to share the curriculum and your child's work/progress. I explained that there have been issues since Twitter changed to X in the summer holidays and that our IT provider is working to resolve them and that this is an issue for all schools. I also explained that the school has purchased a digital platform called SeeSaw which staff are using in school but will be rolling out to parents/carers before Christmas. We also discussed how parents/carers want more trips available to pupils and I explained issues with funding. Lots of ideas were generated about how we could raise funding such as Car Boot Sales and Christmas Fayres/Summer Fayres. Y6 parents/carers had specifically mentioned plans for the end of the year and I stated that we had made some inroads in trying to plan a Y6 residential visit towards the end of the academic year. We also had a discussion regarding the new Relationships Policy (previously called Behaviour Policy) and I stated that I would plan another meeting specifically focused on this matter. In addition, some parents/carers requested that we start the coffee afternoons again and we will ensure we do this moving forward. Finally, thank you for your attendance at the event as approximately 50 families were represented. I am thoroughly looking forward to the next meeting and hope that as many of you can attend as possible.


To secure your place please make sure your child attends their sessions as poor attendance could result in your child's place being withdrawn.







Letter to parents and guardians from Merseyside Police re. Halloween and Bonfire Night

We are writing to all parents and guardians to ask for your help over the upcoming Halloween and Bonfire Night period.

We want everyone to have fun and we'll be working hard to keep you safe, but we need your help:

Know where your children are

- Encourage kids to go to local events that are being organised, or try a spooky film together
- If your children are going out (particularly on the 30th and 31st of October), make sure you
 know where they're going. If possible, drop them off and pick them up
- · Don't let your children hang around the street
- If they're going somewhere local walk there with them
- Have an agreed time when they need to be home
- Don't buy fireworks or eggs and flour for them, and don't let them take it out of the house

Know the risks

- Throwing things at cars, buses, shops and houses can hurt people drivers might swerve if
 they get distracted and cause a crash, or someone might get hurt by broken glass (and
 scratched paintwork can be very expensive to fix)
- Getting into trouble with the police can lead to a criminal record, which means not being able to go on holiday to countries like the USA, and not being able to do certain jobs
- Messing around with fireworks is dangerous some burn as hot as 1,200 degrees hot
 enough to melt glass and cause serious or fatal injuries

Know the law

If a young person under the age of 16 commits any of the offences below, the parent/guardian will have to pay the fine.

- A person under the age of 16 can be arrested and fined if found with an unlit firework
- A person under the age of 16 can also be arrested and fined if they throw or light a firework or make a bonfire
- A person under the age of 16 can be arrested and fined for throwing things like eggs, flour, paint or other objects at people, vehicles or property

Thank you for your help and support. By working together, we can keep your children safe this Halloween and Bonfire Night.
