SCHOOL UNIFORM

School track-suits are for Early Years Children and PE. PE kits to be worn on designated PE days.



SCHOOL UNIFORM



Full school uniform must be worn every day.

Please make sure it has your **CHILD'S NAME** in.

Nursery (F1)

pupil's uniform will be:
 - Royal blue jogging suit consisting of round neck jumper and royal blue jogging bottoms.
 - White polo shirt.
 - Velcro black shoes with black soles.



Reception (F2)

pupil's uniform will be:
 - Royal blue jogging suit consisting of round neck jumper and royal blue jogging bottoms.
 - White polo shirt.
 - Velcro black shoes with black soles.
 - Grey socks or tights.



Year 1 and Year 2

pupil's uniform will be:
 - Royal blue round neck jumper or cardigan.
 - Grey skirt/pinafore or trousers.
 - White polo shirt.
 - Grey socks or tights.



Years 3/4/5/6

pupil's uniform will be:
 - Royal blue V neck jumper or cardigan.
 - Grey skirt/pinafore or trousers.
 - White shirt.
 - School tie.
 - Grey socks or tights.



All children from Reception through to year 6 also require a PE kit.

This consists of:

A white round neck t-shirt.
 Royal blue shorts.
 Royal blue jogging bottoms and Sweatshirt can also be worn.
 Black pumps or black trainers only.



Exceptions can only be made if you have contacted school in advance.



Year 3's Busy Week



This week in Year 3 we have had a very enjoyable time exploring 'textiles' in our art lessons. We have explored different textiles from around the world and we had the opportunity to dip dye our very own piece of fabric in preparation for our printing next week. In maths we have been busy looking at 'Statistics' and we have enjoyed looking at both pictograms and bar charts and learning how to interpret the information which they present. Our English novel 'Jemmy Button' has given us a great insight into what a return narrative looks like and we have enjoyed learning about how Jemmy Button left his jungle home to visit the city but returned home once more. We challenged ourselves to use speech in our writing to convey how Jemmy Button was feeling and to share his thoughts with the reader. In science we have just completed our topic on 'Light' where we have explored how shadows are created and how objects can be translucent, transparent or opaque.
