NURSERY



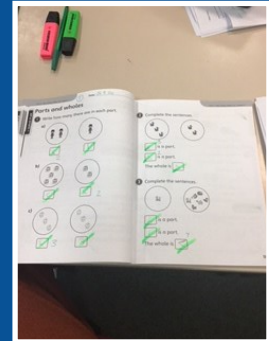
This week in nursery we have been busy exploring the jungle as part of our magical story box. We made our very own binoculars to help us find our way and off we went walking through the jungle.

RECEPTION



This week we have developed upon our personal, social and emotional development. The children have loved exploring our text of the week "Find Your Happy". We have completed numerous activities based around the book but our favourite was discussing our feelings and creating pictures to match how we are feeling. We have also discovered new vocabulary such as: delighted and ecstatic. The children have started using these words during our daily check in's for zones of regulation.

YEAR 1



Amazing work in Maths from Emily-Louise. She recognised the two parts and was able to find what the whole was in our new unit of Maths today all about the part whole model.

YEAR 2



In English we worked in groups to look at the example text. We had to find features the writer had used. We found expanded noun phrases, questions, phrases that show the passing of time and subordinating conjunction.

YEAR 3



In Geography, Year 3 have been looking at Rivers and how they start. We looked at the River Indus and how it travels through three different Countries. We used a map to find where the River Indus is and we created our own maps, labelling them with a key. We found the River Indus starts in the Himalayan Mountain range.

YEAR 4



We have recently started our new topic on the Romans. The children are really enjoying learning about who the first and last king of Rome was and how it became a republic. We even got to try on a Roman helmet!

YEAR 5



This week, we engaged in a role play activity as part of our English lessons. In pairs the children took on the role of either an astronaut, who had just conquered the moon or a high flying journalist reporter, waiting for their next big scoop! It is fair to say some of the lunar accounts were Out of this World!

YEAR 6

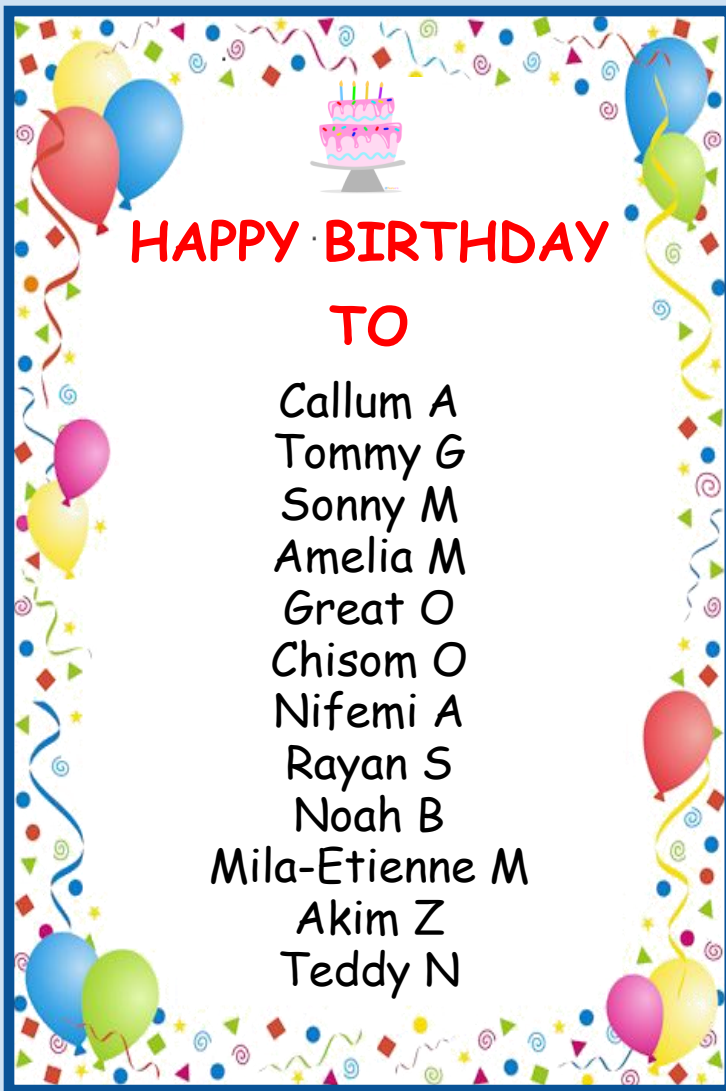


In science, we explored how the circulatory system works. We created our own hearts using a cup balloon and straws to explore how the blood is pumped around our body.

Packed lunch 1

- Tuna, sweetcorn and pepper pasta
- Banana
- Handful of raisins
- Carton of semi-skimmed milk

Packed lunch 2

- Egg cress and cucumber seeded roll
- Rice pudding
- Satsuma
- Bottle of water

Packed lunch 3

- Mackerel and potato salad (peppercorn mackerel, new potatoes, watercress, pepper, cucumber, chives, low fat mayonaisse)
- Fromage frais
- Raspberries
- Bottle of water

Packed lunch 4

- Frittata (eggs, cheese, peas, peppers, sweetcorn)
- Slice of crusty brown bread with low fat spread
- Small tub of seeds, sultanas and chopped dried apricots
- Bottle of water

Packed lunch 5

- Pitta bread, falafel, tzatziki (yogurt and cucumber dip), lettuce and tomato
- Small pear
- Handful of plain popcorn
- Bottle of water

Packed lunch 6

- Wholemeal bagel with ham and soft cheese
- Pol of cherry tomatoes
- Frozen cherries mixed with fromage frais
- Bottle of water

Packed lunch 7

- Hummus
- Carrot and pepper sticks
- Wholemeal pitta bread
- Strawberries
- Yogurt
- Bottle of water

Packed lunch 8

- Chicken, cream cheese and grated carrot wrap
- Fruit kebabs
- Sugar free jelly
- Carton of semi-skimmed milk

Packed lunch 9

- Vegetable and lentil pasta (chopped tomatoes, carrots, celery, onion, red lentils, pasta)
- Small tub of grated cheese
- Canned peaches in natural juice
- Low fat custard
- Bottle of water

- Vegetable cous cous (roasted courgette, peppers, onions, chickpeas, cubed cheese)
- Canned pineapple in juice

SCHOOL UNIFORM



Full school uniform must be worn every day.

Please make sure it has your **CHILD'S NAME** in.

Exceptions can only be made if you have contacted school in advance.

Nursery (F1)

pupil's uniform will be:

- Royal blue jogging suit consisting of round neck jumper and royal blue jogging bottoms.
- White polo shirt.
- Velcro black shoes with black soles.



Reception (F2)

pupil's uniform will be:

- Royal blue jogging suit consisting of round neck jumper and royal blue jogging bottoms.
- White polo shirt.
- Velcro black shoes with black soles.
- Grey socks or tights.



Year 1 and Year 2

pupil's uniform will be:

- Royal blue round neck jumper or cardigan.
- Grey skirt/pinafore or trousers.
- White polo shirt.
- Grey socks or tights.



Years 3/4/5/6

pupil's uniform will be:

- Royal blue V neck jumper or cardigan.
- Grey skirt/pinafore or trousers.
- White shirt.
- School tie.
- Grey socks or tights.



All children from Reception through to year 6 also require a PE kit.

This consists of:

- A white round neck t-shirt.
- Royal blue shorts.
- Royal blue jogging bottoms and Sweatshirt can also be worn.
- Black pumps or black trainers only.

School Penalty Notice Fines for Attendance are Changing from August

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty notices, the following changes will come into effect for all Fines issued after August 19th 2024

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines will now be issued to each parent, for each absent child.

For Example: 3 siblings absent for leave during term time would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

5 Consecutive Days of Term Time Leave

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for term time leave of 5 or more consecutive days. Inset Days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time

10 Sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-Week period

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period

First Offence

The first time a penalty Notice is issued for Term Time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child when paid within 28 days. Reduced to £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days

Second Offence

(within 3 years)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave the amount will be £160 per parent, paid within 28 days

Third Offence (and any further offences within 3 years)

The Third time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates court. Where fines of up to £2500 per parent, per child can be issued

Note: Cases found guilty in Magistrates Court can show on Parents future DBS certificates as a 'Failure to safeguard a child's education'.
