pupil's uniform will be:

- Royal blue round neck jumper or cardigan.
- Grey skirt/pinafore or trousers.
- White polo shirt.
- Grey socks or tights.



Years 3/4/5/6

pupil's uniform will be:

- Royal blue V neck jumper or cardigan.
- Grey skirt/pinafore or trousers.
- White shirt.
- School tie.
- Grey socks or tights.







All children from Reception through to year 6 also require a PE kit.

This consists of:

A white round neck t-shirt.

Royal blue shorts.

Royal blue jogging bottoms and Sweatshirt can also be worn. Black pumps or black trainers only.

YEAR 5




This week, in history, Year 5 have been exploring how and why some stories and even some fragments of stories are missing from history!



















SUMMER READING CHALLENGE with Spellow Library


