

YEAR 1




We had so much fun in PSHE this week. We played a game and we had describe the person to the right of us and say what we like about them!

YEAR 4




Year 4 enjoyed athletics with LFC.

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What Parents & Educators Need to Know about STREAMING SERVICES

Streaming services are platforms that allow users to watch cartoons, documentaries and movies online immediately (often referred to as SVOD; streaming video on demand). Ofcom reported that children and young adults prefer streaming services to traditional TV. With two-thirds of UK households subscribing to at least one streaming service, parents must understand how to manage screen time, set age restrictions and ensure safe viewing.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

- COSTLY** Subscription services can be costly. As the most recent of streaming services, because of hours of content, streaming services have a high monthly subscription fee, services are charging more for each hour of content, and better quality content is becoming more available. Streaming services are also becoming more expensive. Some services are offering a free trial, but these are often limited to a few days and may require a credit card to sign up. - EXCESSIVE SCREEN TIME** Excessive screen time can contribute to mental health problems and can negatively impact physical health. Children who spend too much time watching TV or using streaming services may miss out on other activities, such as physical education, which is important for their overall health and well-being.
- BINGE WATCHING** Features such as autoplay make it easy to continue watching content without stopping. This can lead to binge watching, which can be addictive and harmful to mental health. Parents should be aware of their child's viewing habits and set limits on screen time.
- ILLEGAL STREAMING** Streaming services often require a valid subscription. Some users may use illegal streaming services, which can be a criminal offence. Parents should ensure their child is using legitimate services.
- AGE-INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT** Many streaming platforms offer content that is not suitable for children. Parents should use parental controls to restrict access to age-appropriate content.
- HARMFUL STEREOTYPES** Many streaming services offer content that can reinforce harmful stereotypes. Parents should be aware of the content their child is watching and discuss any stereotypes they see.

Advice for Parents & Educators

- SET UP INDIVIDUAL PROFILES AND ADD PINS** Parents should set up individual profiles for each child and add pins to their favourite content. This allows parents to monitor their child's viewing habits and restrict access to age-appropriate content.
- TALK ABOUT ALGORITHMS** Parents should talk to their child about how streaming services track what they watch, and how this can affect the content they see. Parents should encourage their child to explore different content and not just stick to what they see on the screen.
- MONITOR AND TALK OFTEN** Parents should monitor their child's viewing habits and talk to them about what they are watching. Parents should encourage their child to explore different content and not just stick to what they see on the screen.
- SET TIME RESTRICTIONS** Parents should set time restrictions on their child's streaming services. This can be done through parental controls or by setting a timer on the device.


